

## *Major Differences between Golf and Two-Shot rules*

<b>Rules</b>	<b>Golf 6th Edition</b>	<b>Two-Shot The game of Two-Shot follows the rules of Golf Croquet, except that rules for American Association Croquet apply for striking faults. Also, there are the following modifications:</b>
Starting Position	1 yard from Boundary Corner IV	One yard from the East Boundary line. Between Boundary Corner IV and hoop # 4
Out of Bounds	Touching or past Boundary line Place ball just inside of Boundary Line Allow enough room for a stance	If a ball inside 1-yard of a boundary line, they are marked in to the 1-yard line. If Striker remains in bounds after his 1st shot, then his 2nd shot is taken from Striker's current position, and it is not marked-in.
Double Hits	Not allowed	Allowed (follows Association rules)
Contact While in Stance	Touching any object once in stance. Fault - Lose turn	Allowed accidental touching of the ball one time. Assumed this goes for any object (follows Association rules).
Swing and miss the ball	Still your turn	Counts as your turn. (follows Association rules)
Starting Hoop	#1 Blue	Play starts at a randomly chosen hoop and then proceeds in order.
Bamford-Start	Not allowed	The second player may assume the 1st player ball and his team assumes that ball's color.
Tie-Breaker Hoop	Hoop #3	Next Hoop in order.
First Player	Blue	May rotate in multiple games
Roquet's get 2nd Shot	No second shot any time	Allowed except for corner shots. Allowed for balls of the opponet and not allowed for partner's ball
USCA Tournaments	Yes	No
